It was at that moment that they had a calling to help but not for Arlington but for local cemeteries. Since it was late in the game, they decided to help a cemetery in Sparta, NJ who needed help covering three cemeteries. They were able to raise 1000 wreaths fir them. This began their journey to make a lasting legacy in their hometown of West Milford.

Evan and Matt turned their efforts to promoting and raising funds for West Milford's Veterans who are laid to rest in their hometown, West Milford. They involved all the schools as they visited them presenting to the students what Wreaths Across America is all about. With the support of the local community, they were successful in covering the three cemeteries in town with extra wreaths that were laid in Oakridge. The community came out in numbers as it was estimated that there were over 200 Volunteers. Since this was their Senior Year, they had to pass the reigns over to another student for the following year, Emma Darnsteadt. She took the reigns for 2019 with great success.

Wreaths Across America West Milford did not stop and continued fundraising efforts until COVID-19 out a wrench in the fundraising efforts. Last year we continued to lay the wreaths that we raised in a small volunteer effort. Unfortunately not every Veteran was able to have a wreath but not one went unmentioned as we took to social media to say every veteran's name that is laid to rest on daily posts. We are continuing our fundraising efforts and plans for a ceremony this year and are optimistic that our community will come together once again.

This year, National Wreaths Across America day will be held on Saturday, December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Locally, a ceremony will begin at noon followed by the placement of wreaths at **West Milford Presbyterian**, **St. Joseph's Cemetery, and Cedar Heights Cemetery** located in **West Milford** where there are over 700 interred local veterans are laid to rest. This is open to anyone who would like to attend.

In 2020, there were approximately 235 wreaths placed, leaving approximately 500 veterans without a remembrance wreath. This year our goal is to place 700 plus wreaths. With **your** generosity, we are hoping to meet this goal and ensure no veteran is forgotten. Each hand made, fresh, live wreath cost \$15 to sponsor and is made in the United States with Maine balsam.

On behalf of the volunteers and military families looking to honor all the veterans laid to rest at West Milford's Cemeteries and the Wreaths Across America extended family, I thank you for your consideration of this patriotic cause.
