1.	Board of Health – Araceli Pintle began the presentation by discussing the community health
	needs survey. It is being conducted by Passaic County Health Services and the purpose of the
	survey is to gather data to better serve the residents of the community. In addition to questions
	about health and wellbeing, the survey welcomes comments and suggestions. Ms. Pintle
	asked that Council help and share the flyer so that improvements could be made. The survey
	is posted and available on the website passaiccountynj.org Mayor Dale requested that West
	Milford Channel 77 also advertise the survey.
	REHS Mark Mora went over the highlights of the REHS monthly report, which covered May
	2023 through September 2023. Included were the number of inspections for retail food,
	kennels, recreational bathing sites, and septic and wells. There was also a septic pumping
	update listed. 4,470 were updated and 1980 still need updating. He reported that though the
	process has been tedious progress is being made on the backlog. Mayor Dale asked if the
	number of OPRAs have increased or decreased. Mr. Mora indicated that they have been
	consistently high, the number being 357 and that only includes May through September.
	Responses are also given at the counter to residents as well when they ask for health records
	and those numbers do not count as an OPRA. Councilman Conlon asked if the requests were

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being made by realtors. Mr. Mora indicated that a lot of requests were made by realtors and engineers planning to do work on the properties. Councilman Marsden made the point that not every OPRA is directed to the Health Department, they involve other departments and not health. Mr. Mora clarified for Mayor Dale and Council that plan reviews involve making sure that the septic fields and areas do not fall within setbacks and aren't going to be dug up or affected, so they require approval. Inspections take place when an inspector actually goes out and approves of the work at various stages. Lori Novak-Carafello reported on some of the recent health activities. They have been busy and are partnering with some of the Senior communities, tabling at the farmers market and library for a series of about 12 programs. There was an event where they partnered with ShopRite and did health education and blood pressure checks. National Night Out in August had a good reception of people. Currently there are a series of programs going on at the Rec Center and Camp Hope. Ms. Novak-Carafello met a partner Carol Tyler who works with CART and wants to bring a CART, Community Animal Resource Team to West Milford as there is a big need and the Health Department is working on that for 2024. September was emergency preparedness month. Throughout the month they partnered with the Rec Center, the Senior Center and the Highlands Success Center. In October there was a Breast Cancer awareness program for the Township staff and there are various services, including a diabetes series, and other events coming up on the calendar.

Mayor Dale thanked the Board of Health members and proceeded with the agenda.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 325 STORMWATER MANAGEMENT AND TO CREATE A SECTION ENTITLED "PRIVATELY OWNED SALT STORAGE" WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP CODE

WHEREAS, the Township seeks to update its Code to incorporate new provisions as to privately owned salt storage, and as recently recommended and suggested by the New Jersey Department of Environmental protection; and

WHEREAS, preventing salt leeching and other environmental consequences from improper private salt storage serves to protect the Township's water, and the public's health, safety and welfare.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, and the State of New Jersey that the Township of West Milford Code shall be amended and updated to include a new section, entitled § 325-18, Private Salt Storage, as reflected herein.

SECTION 1. § 325-18 Privately Owned Salt Storage

Purpose: Α.

The purpose of this ordinance is to prevent stored salt and other solid de-icing materials from being exposed to stormwater. This ordinance establishes requirements for the storage of salt and other solid de-icing materials on properties not owned or operated by the municipality (privately-owned), including residences, in the Township of West Milford to protect the environment, public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply.

Definitions: В.

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When consistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- "De-icing materials" means any granular or solid material such as melting salt or any other (1) granular solid that assists in the melting of snow.
- (2) "Impervious surface" means a surface that has been covered with a layer of material so that it is highly resistant to infiltration by water.
- (3) "Storm drain inlet" means the point of entry into the storm sewer system.
- (4) "Permanent structure" means a permanent building or permanent structure that is anchored to a permanent foundation with an impermeable floor, and that is completely roofed and walled (new structures require a door or other means of sealing the access way from wind driven rainfall). A fabric frame structure is a permanent structure if it meets the following specifications:
 - Concrete blocks, jersey barriers or other similar material shall be placed around the (a) interior of the structure to protect the side walls during loading and unloading of de-icing materials;
 - The design shall prevent stormwater run-on and run through, and the fabric cannot leak; (b)

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- (c) The structure shall be erected on an impermeable slab;
- (d) The structure cannot be open sided; and
- (e) The structure shall have a roll up door or other means of sealing the access way from wind driven rainfall.
- (5) "Person" means any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

(6) "Resident" means a person who resides on a residential property where de-icing material is stored.

C. Deicing Material Storage Requirements:

a)

- 1. Temporary outdoor storage of de-icing materials in accordance with the requirements below is allowed between October 15th and April 15th:
 - (a) Loose materials shall be placed on a flat, impervious surface in a manner that prevents stormwater run-through;
 - (b) Loose materials shall be placed at least 50 feet from surface water bodies, storm drain inlets, ditches and/or other stormwater conveyance channels;
 - (c) Loose materials shall be maintained in a cone-shaped storage pile. If loading or unloading activities alter the cone-shape during daily activities, tracked materials shall be swept back into the storage pile, and the storage pile shall be reshaped into a cone after use;
 - (d) Loose materials shall be covered as follows:
 - 1. The cover shall be waterproof, impermeable, and flexible;
 - 2. The cover shall extend to the base of the pile(s);
 - 3. The cover shall be free from holes or tears;
 - 4. The cover shall be secured and weighed down around the perimeter to prevent removal by wind; and
 - 5. Weight shall be placed on the cover(s) in such a way that minimizes the potential of exposure as materials shift and runoff flows down to the base of the pile.
 - Sandbags lashed together with rope or cable and placed uniformly over the flexible cover, or poly-cord nets provide a suitable method. Items that can potentially hold water (e.g., old tires) shall not be used;
 - (e) Containers must be sealed when not in use; and
 - (f) The site shall be free of all de-icing materials between April 16th and October 14th.
- 2. De-icing materials should be stored in a permanent structure if a suitable storage structure is available. For storage of loose de-icing materials in a permanent structure, such storage may be permanent, and thus not restricted to October 15 -April 15.
- 3. All such temporary and/or permanent structures must also comply with all other local ordinances, including building and zoning regulations.
- 4. The property owner, or owner of the de-icing materials if different, shall designate a person(s) responsible for operations at the site where these materials are stored outdoors, and who shall document that weekly inspections are conducted to ensure that the conditions of this ordinance are met. Inspection records shall be kept on site and made available to the municipality upon request.
 - a) Residents who operate businesses from their homes that utilize de-icing materials are required to perform weekly inspections.

D. Exemptions:

Residents may store de-icing materials outside in a solid-walled, closed container that prevents precipitation from entering and exiting the container, and which prevents the de-icing materials from leaking or spilling out. Under these circumstances, weekly inspections are not necessary, but repair or replacement of damaged or inadequate containers shall occur within 2 weeks.

If containerized (in bags or buckets) de-icing materials are stored within a permanent structure, they are not subject to the storage and inspection requirements in Section III above. Piles of de-icing materials are not exempt, even if stored in a permanent structure.

This ordinance does not apply to facilities where the stormwater discharges from de-icing material storage activities are regulated under another NJPDES permit.

E. Enforcement:

This ordinance shall be enforced by the Township of West Milford Police Department and/or other Township Officials, including but not limited to the Township Zoning Officer during the course of ordinary enforcement duties.

F. Violations and Penalties:

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall have 72 hours to complete corrective action. Repeat violations and/or failure to complete corrective action shall result in fines and penalties pursuant to Township Chapter I, Article III, General Penalty, or as applicable, to the maximum penalty as provided under state statute or regulation.

G. Severability:

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase, and finding or holding of any such portion

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of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause or reason shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

F. Effective Date:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Township of West Milford inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY CREATING A NEW SECTION WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP CODE WITHIN PART II, GENERAL LEGISLATION AS CHAPTER XXX, AND ENTITLED LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR RENTAL DWELLINGS

WHEREAS, effective July 22, 2022, the Legislature enacted P.L. 2021, c. 182, "An Act concerning certain lead-based paint hazard and residential rental property and establishing lead-based paint hazard programs, supplementing P.L. 2003, c. 311 (C. 52:27D-437.1 et al.) amending various parts of the statutory law, and making an appropriation;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(b)(1) a municipality that maintains a permanent local agency for the purpose of conducting inspections and enforcing laws, ordinances, and regulations concerning buildings and structures, is required to inspect for lead-based paint hazards in certain specified single-family, two-family, and multiple rental dwellings, at the time periods set forth in the statute; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(b)(2) a municipality that does not maintain such a permanent local agency must hire a lead evaluation contractor, certified to provide lead paint inspection services by the DCA, or enter a shared services agreement as permitted by law, for the purpose of conducting the inspections for lead-based paint hazards; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, Passaic County, New Jersey, that the Code of the Township of West Milford shall be updated to include the following new Chapter XXX, entitled Lead-Based Paint Inspection Requirements for Rental Dwellings, for the purpose of assisting the municipality with inspection requirements and fees for compliance of P.L. 2021, c. 182 and will read as follows:

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SECTION 1. Chapter XXX - Lead-Based Paint Hazard Inspection Requirements for Rental Dwellings

§ XXX-1 Definitions.

§ Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply to this article:

COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY

A real-estate development or neighborhood in which the property is burdened by servitudes requiring property owners to contribute to maintenance of commonly held property or to pay dues or assessments to an owner's association that provides services or facilities to the community.

DUST WIPE SAMPLING

A sample collected by wiping a representative surface and tested in accordance with a method approved by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD

Any condition that causes exposure to lead from lead-contaminated dust or lead contaminated paint that is deteriorated or present in surfaces that would result in adverse human health effects.

LEAD INSPECTOR

A person certified by the Department of Community Affairs to perform lead inspection and risk assessment work pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:17-1.1, *et seq*. This includes the ability to perform dust wipe sampling.

LEAD-FREE CERTIFICATION

A certification which confirms that a lead-based paint inspection was performed and that no lead basedpaint exists in the dwelling unit or that all lead-based paint hazards have been fully abated.

LEAD-SAFE CERTIFICATION

A certification which confirms that a lead-based paint inspection was performed and no lead-based paint hazards were found. This certification is valid for two years from the date of issuance.

TENANT TURNOVER

The time at which all existing occupants vacate a dwelling unit and all new tenants move into the dwelling unit.

VISUAL ASSESSMENT

A visual examination for deteriorated paint or visible surface dust, debris, or residue.

VISUAL ASSESSOR

A person that is certified to perform a visual assessment.

§ Requirement for Lead-Based Paint Inspection.

- A. All residential rental dwelling units required to be inspected under state law must initially be inspected for lead-based paint hazards upon tenant turnover, but the first inspection must take place no later than July 22, 2024, in the event there has been no tenant turnover before that date.
- B. After the initial inspection, all units required to be inspected shall be inspected for lead-based paint hazards every three years, or upon tenant turnover, whichever is earlier. An inspection upon tenant turnover is not required if the owner has a valid lead-safe certificate. Lead-safe certificates are valid for two years. If the lead-safe certificate has expired, and there will be a tenant turnover, an inspection will be necessary before the three-year inspection.

§ Reporting Requirements for Owners/Landlords and Contractors.

- A. Owners/landlords of all dwellings subject to the inspection requirements under this section shall register their unit(s) with the Township Clerk and also provide the Township with up-to-date information on inspection schedules, inspection results, and tenant turnover.
- B. An owner/landlord shall provide the Township with a copy of any lead-safe certification issued by a lead evaluation contractor.

C. An owner/landlord shall provide the Township with a copy of any lead-free certification issued pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:17 for their unit(s).

§ Lead-Based Paint Inspection.

A. A lead inspector or visual assessor shall inspect every single-family, two-family, and multiple rental dwelling located within the municipality for lead-based paint hazards through visual assessment and dust wipe sampling in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 *et seq.*, as may be amended from time to time.

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- B. The property owner or landlord may, in lieu of having the dwelling inspected by the municipality's lead inspector, directly hire a private lead inspector who is certified to provide lead paint inspection services by the Department of Community Affairs to perform the lead-based paint inspection in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 *et seq.*, as may be amended from time to time.
- C. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(c), a dwelling unit in a single-family, two-family, or multiple rental dwelling shall not be subject to inspection and evaluation for the presence of lead-based paint hazards if the unit:
- (1) has been certified to be free of lead-based paint;
- (2) was constructed during or after 1978;
- (3) is in a multiple dwelling that has been registered with the Department of Community Affairs as a multiple dwelling for at least 10 years, either under the current or a previous owner, and has no outstanding lead violations from the most recent cyclical inspection performed on the multiple dwelling under the "Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law";
- (4) is a single-family or two-family seasonal rental dwelling which is rented for less than six months duration each year by tenants that do not have consecutive lease renewals; or
- (5) has a valid lead-safe certification.
- D. If lead-based paint hazards are identified, then the owner of the dwelling shall remediate the hazards through abatement or lead-based paint hazard control mechanisms in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(d). Upon the remediation of the lead-based paint hazard, the municipality's lead inspector or visual assessor, as may be applicable, or the owner's private lead inspector, shall conduct an additional inspection of the unit to certify that the hazard no longer exists.
- E. If no lead-based paint hazards are identified then the municipality's lead inspector or the owner's private lead inspector shall certify the dwelling as lead safe on a form prescribed by the Department of Community Affairs, which shall be valid for two years.
- F. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(e), property owners shall:
- (1) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification and the most recent tenant turnover to the municipality at the time of the cyclical inspection.
- (2) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification to new tenants of the property at the time of tenant turnover and shall affix a copy of such certification as an exhibit to the tenant's or tenants' lease.
- (3) Maintain a record of the lead-safe certification which shall include the name or names of the unit's tenant or tenants if the inspection was conducted during a period of tenancy.
- G. The fees for a lead-based paint inspection shall be as follows:
- (1) The fee for a visual assessment inspection performed by the municipal lead inspector shall be \$250 for a dwelling unit that has one bedroom. There shall be an additional fee of \$25 for each additional bedroom in the dwelling unit.
- (2) Where it may be necessary to collect dust wipe samples to test for lead dust hazards, the fee shall be \$30 per dust wipe with a minimum of six (6) dust wipes required in accordance with the HUD Guidelines for the Evaluation and Control of Lead-Based Paint Hazards in Housing.
- (3) Where an independent inspection or risk assessment determines that no lead-based paint hazard exists in a dwelling unit, the fee for the filing of a lead-safe certification or lead-free certification shall be \$25.
- (4) The fee for conduction a visual reinspection performed by the municipal lead inspector shall be \$100 for a 1 bedroom dwelling unit and \$20 for each additional bedroom. Additional dust wipe sampling fees as aforementioned shall be applied if applicable.
- (5) In a common interest community, any inspection fee charged shall be the responsibility of the unit owner and not the homeowners' association, unless the association is the owner of the unit.
- (6) In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(h), an additional fee of \$20 per dwelling unit inspected by the municipal lead inspector or the owner's private lead inspector shall be assessed for the purposes of the "Lead Hazard Control Assistance Act" unless the unit owner demonstrates that the Department of Community Affairs has already assessed an additional inspection fee of \$20. The fees collected pursuant to this paragraph shall be deposited into the "Lead Hazard Control Assistance Fund."

§ Violations and Penalties.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.19, the penalties for a violation of this chapter shall be as follows:

- A. If a property owner has failed to conduct the required inspection or initiate any remediation efforts, the owner shall be given 30 days to cure the violation.
- B. If the property owner has not cured the violation after 30 days, the property owner shall be subject

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to a penalty not to exceed \$1,000 per week until the required inspection has been conducted or remediation efforts have been initiated.

- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.
