Items for Curbside Collection Available to all Taxpayers

PLACE RECYCLING/GARBAGE OUT ON DAY OF COLLECTION PRIOR TO 6AM OR THE NIGHT BEFORE IN SECURE CONTAINERS, CONTRACTOR STARTS AT 6:00 AM. Return containers from curbside before next day.

CURBSIDE COLLECTION

<u>GARBAGE and TRASH:</u> Collection is once a week with a limit of 3 cans of household garbage, one bulk item and one bundle of construction debris. For garbage, use a secure 32-gallon can no heavier than 50 lbs. Place neatly at curb by 6am or the night before. Remove emptied containers at end of day. Clear area during snow events.

<u>BULKY ITEMS</u>: Items such as furniture and mattresses will be collected on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day with a limit of one bulk item per collection.

<u>CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS/CARPET</u>: One bundle of construction debris or carpet will be collected on your garbage day. Carpet shall be cut into 4' wide strips, rolled and bundled. Construction debris, 4' long x 3' high tied, no heavier than 50 lbs.

SCRAP METAL & APPLIANCES: Assorted metals, including appliances, shall be collected once each month, in accordance to schedule below. To receive service, call: 973-728-2724

<u>Includes</u>: Refrigerators, stoves, air conditioners, items with 95% or more metal content. Pipes and poles no longer than 5 feet.

Not included: Electronics (see above), copy machines, propane tanks.

Scrap Metal Collected monthly. Freon must be removed from: air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers and dehumidifiers by a licensed HVAC Tech. Sticker required.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION & RECYCLING REGULATIONS

Commingle = Bottles/Cans/Plastic:

- Plastic Containers: #1, 2, and 5 symbols only no plastic lids, toys, etc.
- Metal Cans: (Tin/Steel) Soup, food, coffee cans, etc.
- Aluminum: Food and beverage containers. Soda/beer cans, pet food, pie plates, etc.
- · All rinsed and clean milk, OJ, broth, juice box containers are recyclable and go in with commingle.
- Curbside recycling WILL NOT BE COLLECTED IF IN PLASTIC BAGS Place recyclable items in a 32-gallon trash can

Materials not accepted with recycling material (put out with garbage): Mirrors, window or auto glass, bulbs, ceramics, plastics without a number, plastics with numbers 3, 4, 7, 8, and 9, needles/syringes, hazardous materials, pesticide, chemical, antifreeze and oil containers, paper products, plastic bags, plastic film, coat hangers, paint cans, aerosol cans, tar pails, vacuum and pool hoses, pool liners, shower curtains, PVC pipe, plumbing accessories, toys, building products, plastic fencing, wire, electrical equipment, dishware, Styrofoam, food trays, pots, pans, toasters and small appliances, flower pots, nursery trays, rubber hoses, bowling balls, food or party trays, trash.

Paper and Cardboard:

- Brown Paper bags
- Flattened Cardboard
- Junk Mail
- Magazines
- Paperboard (cereal boxes, paper towel rolls, etc.)
- Newspaper Inserts
 Phone Books
- Office paper

Materials not accepted with recycling material (put out with garbage): Pizza boxes, trash or construction debris, yard waste, packing materials (Styrofoam, bubble wrap etc.) paper cups, plates or towels, wax-coated cardboard. All paper should be clean and dry.

Recycling Center Regulations & Hours:

Taxpayers who have curbside collection may not take recyclables to the Recycling Center. The large containers at the Recycling Center are available for businesses that do not have curbside collections. All Taxpayers may use the containers listed on the front cover for drop off items that are not collected curbside.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ENCLOSED!! NEW RECYCLING CENTER HOURS NEW RECYCLING REGULATIONS

Due to a dramatic change in the disposal market for recyclable materials, the Township must change the items being collected and the collection process.

Commingle = Bottles/Cans/Plastic: Plastic Containers: #1, 2, and 5 symbols only. No other plastics can be accepted. If other plastics are delivered to the disposal market, the Township will be billed double. Comingled materials cannot be placed in plastic bags and will not be collected at the curb.

Paper & Cardboard: No Pizza Boxes; No trash or construction debris; No yard waste; No packing materials (Styrofoam, bubble wrap etc.) No paper cups, plates or towels; No wax coated cardboard. All paper must be clean & dry.

Recycling Center will not accept materials that can be placed at the curb for collection

TIRES: Auto - \$ 2.00; Auto Tires w/rims - \$ 2.50; Truck Tires - Fee varies w/size.

AUTO BATTERIES: All auto batteries can be brought to the Recycling Center. No Fee.

MOTOR OIL: Put motor oil in sealed container. There is a .30 cent per gallon charge.

ELECTRONICS: Stereos, computers, TV's, phones, printers, digital cameras, and smoke detectors.

GRASS CLIPPINGS: Grass should either be cut or left as natural fertilizer on your lawn or home compost.

BRUSH/CHRISTMAS TREES: Brush and Christmas Trees are accepted free of charge for WM residents (less than 4" in diameter) at Skytop Recycling. No Stumps or Construction Debris. Skytop Recycling is located at 80 Airport Road, West Milford, Mon - Fri 7am to 3pm, Sat. 6am to 11am, Closed on Sunday, PHONE: 973-728-4444.



Attention West Milford Residents:

Important New Garbage/Recycling Information

- Please keep all paper/cardboard dry and in a covered receptacle or cover with tarp. Any paper/cardboard that is wet is not recyclable and must be placed out for garbage.
- Garbage/Recycling must be at the curb by 6:00am on collection day. New contractor has extra trucks collecting, collection times will be earlier.
- Plastic Containers with #1, 2 and 5 symbols only will be collected with commingle. (Bottles, glass and plastic)
- Pizza boxes no longer recyclable, dispose of with garbage.
- Scrap Metal will be collected on a call-in basis only. (by zones) Call 973-728-2724 to be added to the list.

WEST MILFORD TOWNSHIP SNOW SEASON INFORMATION

Garbage and Recycling Collection

- During snow or snow removal operations, garbage and/or recycling pickup may have to be rescheduled. For information contact the Recycling Division office at 973-728-2724.
- The garbage and recycling collection schedule is available on the Township's homepage <u>www.westmilford.org</u> (under Departments / DPW-Recycling & Solid Waste). The schedule is also available through the free **My Waste** app.
- If snow is forecast and pickup has not yet been cancelled, garbage and/or recycling cans should be placed in the driveway a few feet back from the edge of the road. The Township is not responsible for damaged cans.

No Snow in the Road

- Under Township Code: Chapter 332, Article 5, Section 36, it is prohibited to throw, place or deposit snow or ice into or upon any road within the Township.
- Generally, when snow accumulation exceeds 4", roads are initially opened for access.
 Depending on duration and total accumulation, roads may be plowed several times throughout the storm. Therefore, driveways may be plowed in repeatedly.
- When clearing driveway snow near the road, it is best to throw it to the right as this may reduce the amount of snow plowed back into driveways.
- Markers along the edge of roads without curb can help to reduce damage to landscaping.

No Parking on Snow Covered Roads

 As per Township Code: Chapter 10, Section 3.4, parking is prohibited on all Township, Public / Private or County roadways for snow plowing and snow removal.

Mailboxes

- Proper location of mailboxes allows for clearing the full width of roads, while reducing the risk
 of damage to mailboxes. The face of the mailbox should be 6" to 8" back from the curb face
 or edge of pavement and 41" to 45" above the ground. See Postal Service guidelines at
 www.usps.com/manage/mailboxes.htm
- The Township may reimburse up to \$50 for damage when inspected and confirmed that the mailbox has been hit by the plow or the plow truck.

STORMWATER POLLUTION: WHAT DO YOU THINK?



You may think littering is no big deal (it is).

You may think that whatever runs into the storm drains gets treated before it reaches local rivers and streams (it doesn't).

You may think motor oil and other hazardous materials doesn't harm the water very much (it does). Contaminated stormwater is the #1 cause of water pollution in New Jersey. Simple things, like proper clean-up after oneself and careful use of chemicals in the home, office and yard, are helpful ways for businesses and residents to protect the water.

West Milford Township has Ordinances aimed at reducing pollution from litter, fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, animal waste, grass clippings and other debris. For details see www.westmilford.org. Thank you for keeping them in mind and doing your share.

- Keep grass, leaves and trash out of storm drains.
- Don't feed wildlife.
- · Clean up after your pet.
- Limit use of fertilizers and pesticides.
- Properly handle hazardous products.
