ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 420-8 PLANNING BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes to update the Township Code to comply with State Law; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-23—Planning Board Membership, directs that as to Class IV membership, such members be "other citizens of the municipality, to be appointed by the Mayor" and in accord with the Township of West Milford's form of government; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council further desires to establish the Township Planning Board as composed of seven (7) members and as permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-23 and to remove certain office-holder designations as previously reflected within Class IV membership.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, Passaic County, New Jersey, that the Code of the Township of West Milford shall be repealed and replaced and as to Chapter 420-8 Planning Board, Paragraph A "Establishment, composition" only, to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 420-8 Planning Board

§420-8 Planning Board

- A. Establishment; composition. A Planning Board is hereby established consisting of seven (7) members of the following four classes:
 - (1) Class I: The Mayor.
 - (2) Class II: One of the officials of the Township other than a member of the Township Council, appointed by the Mayor.
 - (3) Class III: A member of the Township Council to be appointed by the Township Council.
 - (4) Class IV: Four (4) citizens of the Township plus two other citizens to act as alternate members, to be appointed by the Mayor. The members of Class IV shall hold no other municipal office, with the exception that a member of the Environmental Commission who is also a member of the Planning Board as required by N.J.S.A. 40:56A-1 shall be a Class IV Planning Board member.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, preempted by Federal or State law, or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** No provision of this Ordinance shall be construed to impair any common law or statutory cause of action, or legal remedy there from, of any person for injury or damage arising from any violation of this Ordinance or from other law.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution provides: "A well regulated militia necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed"; and

WHEREAS, in <u>District of Columbia v. Heller</u>, 554 U.S. 570 (2008) the United States Supreme Court affirmed that the Second Amendment protects an individual right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, and is unconnected to militia or military service; and

WHEREAS, in <u>Heller</u>, the United States Supreme Court further explained that the "Second Amendment does not protect those weapons [which are] not typically possessed by law-abiding citizens for lawful purposes …" <u>Id.</u> at 625; and

WHEREAS, abridging the rights of law-abiding gun owners that possess and use firearms for lawful purposes does not reduce the criminal use of firearms by violent offenders for unlawful purposes; and

WHEREAS, violations of existing laws, statutes and regulations are already criminal offenses, many being felonies; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey gun control laws are "highly purposed and conscientiously designed toward preventing criminal and other unfit elements from acquiring firearms while enabling the fit elements of society to obtain them with minimal burdens and inconveniences" <u>Burton v. Stills</u>, 53 N.J. 86 (1968); and

WHEREAS, after a law-abiding citizen has completed an application to purchase a handgun and for N.J. Firearms Purchaser Identification Card, and the Chief of Police of the Township of West Milford has thoroughly reviewed and approved such applications in accordance with applicable laws of this State, upon issuance of a permit to purchase a handgun and/or a N.J. Firearms Purchaser Identification Card that citizen has established that they are of good character, fitness and lawfully qualified to purchase and possess a firearm unless and until they otherwise become unqualified.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, that the Township is hereby declared a "Second Amendment Lawful Gun Owner Township" as further described in detail as follows:

- The Township supports the rights of lawful gun owners to lawfully use firearms for selfdefense, to lawfully hunt, and to lawfully participate in shooting sports up to and including Olympic sports in accordance with Federal and State laws;
- ii. The Township opposes interference with, or infringement of, the rights of law-abiding citizens to legally purchase and lawfully own, possess, and use firearms in accordance with Federal and State laws;
- iii. The Township espouses to hold accountable and protect against violent criminal offenders and those who are unqualified and/or unfit to purchase, own, possess, and use firearms instead of irrational and/or disproven attempts to control lawful use of firearms for self-defense, hunting and sport;

Councilwoman Erik – Found the round table to be very productive. Spoke with Steve Sangle regarding the "Adopt a Storm Drain" campaign and the plan will be to walk neighborhoods and ask residents to adopt storm drains. There may be some 6,000 storm drains and there is a map with their locations.

<u>Councilman Chazukow</u> – Has been keeping an eye on the cannabis marketplace regulation. In December the State began accepting applications for grow houses and March 15th they will begin accepting applications for retail businesses. His thoughts were that all the classes of licenses for cannabis were going to be permitted everywhere except in residential areas and that doesn't appear to be the case and he would like it to be revised by J. Caldwell prior to the next meeting to meet upcoming deadlines. Councilman Chazukow clarified when questioned by Councilman Gross, that there are no licensed cannabis sellers in West Milford currently and the Attorney General has decided not to prosecute the people who are currently selling it as we are in a transition phase. The State may ramp up enforcement once all the licensing is complete. All Councilmembers were in favor of revising the Zoning Ordinance.
